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## Abstract:

What is education for in a time of ecological emergency? This work draws on lyric philosophy (Jan Zwicky) and the hermeneutic materialism of Walter Benjamin—particularly his collage-inspired compositions—to examine place-based education, Indigenous ways of knowing, and ecological ethics in the context of settler colonialism and the sixth extinction. The notion of tacking a few modules on sustainability to the science curriculum is clearly not sufficient to cultivate a deeper sense of ecological consciousness. This work critiques the ideal of an educated mind as defined by "formal operational" thinking, and attempts to point towards and enact a new kind of epistemological orientation (i.e. formal ecological thinking). The unconventional composition of the work is, in fact, the educational implication. By composing a "complex ecology of argumentation" the work attempts to cultivate an "ecosophic disposition" in order to recognize the significance of wisdom traditions, contemplative practices and critical reflexivity in a more-than-human world.
